

Debenham Parish Council

Expenses Policy

It is the aim of Debenham Parish Council that no member will be financially disadvantaged when representing Debenham Parish Council. Debenham Parish Council will make reimbursement for all or some of the expenses incurred by the Clerk/RFO, Chairman or Councillors when performing the duties required of the Council.

No expenses will be paid for attendance at any parish council meeting of Debenham Parish Council by councillors.

1. Chairman & Councillor Expenses

The Chairman and Councillors will be able to claim the following expenses:

- The reasonable cost of necessary travel in connection with council business will be reimbursed. The most economic means of travel should be chosen if practicable and existing travelcards or season tickets wherever possible should be used.
- Trains. The Parish Council will reimburse the cost of standard class travel on submission of a receipt with an expense claim form.
- Taxis. A taxi should not be used when there is public transport available, unless it is cost effective due to a significant saving of journey time. A receipt should be obtained for submission with a claim form.
- Car. Where it is cost effective for a car to be used for business travel, a mileage allowance may be claimed. Details of the current mileage rates can be obtained from the RFO/Clerk. Any necessary parking costs can be reimbursed as long as they are supported by a receipt or the display ticket.
- The Parish Council will not reimburse penalty fares or fines for parking or driving offences, other than at the Council's discretion in exceptional circumstances.
- Subsistence which may include overnight accommodation and meals incurred in the performance of Council business provided that expenses have been receipted and approved by the Council.
- Items purchased specifically at the direction of the Council. Claims shall be made on the appropriate forms available/or production of receipt. Members shall obtain a VAT receipt in the name of the Council and pass this on to the Clerk/RFO.
- Office consumables such as paper and ink. If necessary members may obtain these from the Clerk. All claims submitted are subject to an annual limit of £20 and shall be made on the appropriate forms/production of receipt. Members shall obtain a VAT receipt in the name of the Council and pass this on to the Clerk.

2. Clerk/RFO Expenses

a) The Clerk will be able to claim the following expenses:

The reasonable cost of necessary travel in connection with council business will be reimbursed. The most economic means of travel should be chosen if practicable and existing travelcards or season tickets wherever possible should be used.

Mileage can be claimed for attendance at additional council meetings but not the regular monthly evening meeting.

Trains. The Parish Council will reimburse the cost of standard class travel on submission of a receipt with an expense claim form.

Taxis. A taxi should not be used when there is public transport available, unless it is cost effective due to a significant saving of journey time. A receipt should be obtained for submission with a claim form.

Car. Where it is cost effective for a car to be used for business travel, the current Mileage allowance may be claimed. Any necessary parking costs can be reimbursed as long as they are supported by a receipt or the display ticket.

The Parish Council will not reimburse penalty fares or fines for parking or driving offences, other than at the Council's discretion in exceptional circumstances.

Subsistence which may include overnight accommodation and meals incurred in the performance of Council business provided that expenses have been receipted and approved by the Council.

- b) Stamps and stationery and other office consumables.
- c) Items purchased specifically at the direction of the Council.
- d) Other expenses - documentary evidence will be required for such items spent on Council related costs.
- e) All claims shall be made on the appropriate forms/production of receipts.
